Psalm 33 "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."

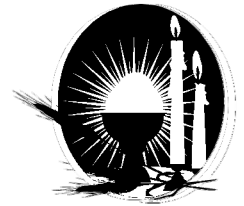
Hebrews 4:14-16 Let us confidently approach the throne of grace.

Dear Parishioners:



Saint Eugene Property Update: As you may know my responsibility as *Parish Administrator* is the care of the operations, finance and buildings which are all associated within our parish. These include the church, school, (even though the school is a regional school we are the landlord) the church offices, priest residence and grounds. In the past two weeks I have met and walked the grounds with our representative from *Catholic Mutual* which is our insurance company. As we walked through the properties we have found that there are a multitude of issues and violations that go back many years. All of these items are being addressed in the order of their importance. First and foremost in the church offices and meeting rooms it was found that not one of the smoke detectors or emergency lights is in working order. Also many fire extinguishers are empty and need to be filled; in addition the hood over the school stove, which is used for cooking by many of our organizations, is not up to code. The fire and safety company is currently working on this. Secondly, the issue was the grounds, trees and shrubs. Many of the trees and shrubs were trimmed or removed. Many have asked why take out perfectly good trees, well the reason is that we have drainage issues and clogging of gutters and leaders. These little issues lead to bigger problems with seepage into the foundation and ultimately crumbling of walls. There was also a tree on the corner of the school property that had been struck by lightning a few years back. When the tree surgeon as well as the insurance representative looked at the tree they discovered that it was completely rotted and was in danger of falling in heavy rain or wind. The third issue is the roof of the church. As you are sitting in the pews, please look up there are stains in many areas of the ceiling as well as many ceiling tiles that are missing. Many of these are near the light fixtures which can cause a multitude of problems. The ceiling has leaks which are coming through the ten air conditioners (which also will need replacing) located on the two levels of the roof. When it rains, the rain enters through the fans in the unit and drips into the rotted pans which then lead to the water coming into the church via ceiling tiles, this is an issue that is long standing with the Archdiocese and has been ignored. For the roofing issues I am working with the representative of *Aramark*, an Archdiocesan company which takes care of all of our buildings. I have had two walk-throughs this past week with him and we are compiling all of the information so that we can address the issues before winter and do it in a timely and most important, fiscal manner. We are also in the process of dealing with roof and gutter issues in the church offices and priest residences. In addition to these issues the boiler in the church office does not work and we do not have any service contracts with heating and air conditioning companies. This is also being addressed this week. Also the locks on the school and its doors are being changed this week due to the break-in and vandalism which occurred on Labor Day weekend.

October 18, 2015, World Mission Sunday: World Mission Sunday is a day set aside for the Catholic Church throughout the world to publicly renew its commitment to the missionary movement. It is celebrated on the third Sunday of October every year. It was created by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer for missions.

Almighty God, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to reconcile the world to yourself: We praise and bless you for those whom you have sent in the power of the Spirit to preach the Gospel to all nations. We thank you that in all parts of the earth a community of love has been gathered together by their prayers and labors, and that in every place your servants call upon your Name; for the kingdom and the power and the glory are yours forever. *Amen*

Meditations on the Magnificat of the Blessed Virgin Mary... Part 41

“And Mary said... “The hungry He (God) has filled with good things; the rich He has sent away empty.” (Luke 1:53)



Genesis 13:2

Ow Abram was very rich in livestock, silver, and gold.

1 Chronicles 29:12

Riches and glory are from You, and You have dominion over all. In Your hand are power and might; it is Yours to give greatness and strength to all.

Psalms 119:14

I find joy in the way of your testimonies more than in all riches.

Proverb 11:28

Those who trust in their riches will fall, but like green leaves the just will flourish.

Proverb 18:23

The poor implore, but the rich answer harshly.

Proverb 22:4

The result of humility and fear of the Lord is riches, honor and life.

Proverb 28:20

The trustworthy will be richly blessed; but whoever hastens to be rich will not go unpunished.

So Our Blessed Mother has said, *“the rich He has sent away empty”* and Her Son, Our God and Savior said, *“Amen I say to you, it will be hard for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of heaven. Again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for the one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God?”* (Matthew 19:23) Firstly from the understanding of the Jewish people, as we see in the quotes to the left, it is God who blesses with riches; it is God who chooses who is blessed; those who are in possession of riches are understood to be blessed by God. So why do Our Lord and His Holy Mother speak disparaging of those who are rich?

The Book of Revelation answers that question, thusly, *“For you say, ‘I am rich and affluent and have no need of anything,’ and yet (you) do not realize you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked.”* (3:17) All we need do is look at one person after another (Sports figures, actors, and the like) who seemingly has everything, wealth, property, fame and popularity, who throw it all away much like the younger son in the Parable of the Prodigal Son, *“(The Older Son) said to his father in reply, ‘Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your (younger) son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.”* (Luke 15:29) Upon reading this passage, you might automatically assume that the younger son is the one we are referring to regarding the challenges of wealth having *“swallowed up your property with prostitutes.”* But, the Older Son is equally to blame. As His Father responded to him, *“My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours.”* (Luke 15:31) Those who are rich are in

danger of losing all that they have because of the lure of money to a variety of distractions and sinful ways, as well as, becoming so complacent in their comfort that they become as the Book of Revelation has written, *“For you say, ‘I am rich and affluent and have no need of anything,’ and yet (you) do not realize you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked.”*

This is why Our Blessed Lady and Our Blessed Lord both give the warning to the rich. And we should thank them. What would be better, ignore the challenges that those with wealth face and leave them to their own devices. How is that caring and spiritually responsible? By speaking as they have, the rich are not being blamed for being rich, they are being cautioned about the pitfalls they will face. It is like the sign... BRIDGE OUT. With a sigh of relief, and maybe a quick *act of contrition* we thank God for that sign. Our Holy Mother and Her Son having given us a sign... CAUTION... *“The gift you have been given (by God), give as a gift.”* (Matthew 10:8b)
