**Pastoral Visit:** On Sunday February 12<sup>th</sup> Timothy Cardinal Dolan will be the main celebrant at the 10:00 AM Mass. We are pleased to welcome the Cardinal to the Church of Saint Eugene.



**National Catholic School:** Catholic week begins today, January 29<sup>th</sup> and continues through February 4<sup>th</sup>. We welcome the children of our school at 10:00 Mass this morning.



The theme of this year's Catholic School Week is Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service. Please pray for our students, faculty and staff and all those who bring not only the fundamentals of education but bring it in a catholic environment teaching the faith.

**Presentation of Our Lord:** Thursday, February 2, we celebrate Feast of the Purification of the Virgin, or Candlemas Day. Dear Mommy and Daddy,

I'm okay. I'm with God. Jesus took me by the hand and brought me to this wonderful place. I'm at peace and also very happy. But when I think of you both, which I do so many times a day, I see sad faces... I see pain in your hearts. I hear your thoughts... when you think of what could have been... all the birthdays, Kindergarten, Grade School and High School Graduations, my wedding day... your grandchildren. I know your prayers... asking God to forgive you... asking me to forgive you... to take away the guilt... to take away the pain.



Mommy and Daddy, I love you. I love you more than you could ever know. I have forgiven you from the very beginning. God loves you too.
