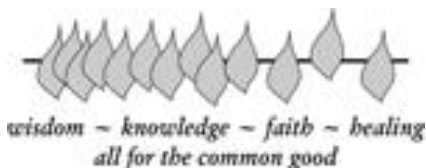

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 The Spirit calls the baptized to ministry for the common good.

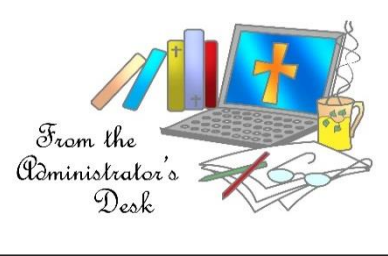

Dear Parishioners:

Pentecost Sunday, June 4, Pentecost Sunday is a commemoration and celebration of the receiving of the Holy Spirit by the early church. John the Baptist prophesied of the first Pentecost when Jesus would baptize



with the Holy Spirit and with fire (Matthew 3:11). Jesus confirmed this prophecy with the promise of the Holy Spirit to the disciples in John 14:26. He showed Himself to these men after His death on the cross and His resurrection, giving convincing proofs that He was alive. Jesus told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem for the Father's gift of the Holy Spirit, from whom they would receive power to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:3-8). After Jesus' Ascension to Heaven, the men returned to Jerusalem and joined together in prayer in an upper room. On the Day of Pentecost, just as promised, the sound of a violent wind filled the house and tongues of fire came to rest on each of them and all were filled with the Holy Spirit. They were given the power of communication, which Peter used to begin the ministry for which Jesus had

prepared him. After the coming of the Holy Spirit, the disciples did not stay in the room basking in God's glory but burst out to tell the world. This was the beginning of the church as we know it. Today, in many Christian churches, Pentecost Sunday is celebrated to recognize the gift of the Holy Spirit, realizing that God's very life, breath and energy live in believers. During this service, John 20:19-23 may be the core of the message about our risen Savior supernaturally appearing to the fear-laden disciples. Their fear gave way to joy when the Lord showed them His hands and side. He assured them peace and repeated the command given in Matthew 28:19-20, saying, "As the Father has sent Me, I am sending you." Then He breathed on them, and they received the Holy Spirit (John 20:21-23). The celebration of Pentecost Sunday reminds us of the reality that we all have the unifying Spirit that was poured out upon the first-century church in Acts 2:1-4. It is a reminder that we are co-heirs with Christ, to suffer with Him that we may also be glorified with Him; that the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good (1 Corinthians 12:7); that we are all baptized by one Spirit into one body (1 Corinthians 12:13); and that the Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead lives inside believers (Romans 8:9-11). This gift of the Holy Spirit that was promised and given to all believers on the first Pentecost is promised for you and your children and for all who are far off whom the Lord our God will call (Acts 2:39).

Beloved of God,

The Solemnity of Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary at Pentecost



“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place

together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them.” (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-3)

“Tongues as of fire” appeared in the Upper Room where the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary were staying... “tongues as of fire.” In a forest, the fire is a natural cleansing tool, a part of the cycle of life, which rids the land of older dead trees and brush. The ashes that remain after the fire are the food for the future plants to feed off and grow. Also, in the place reserved and confined within the home whether that be the hearth or the furnace, fire is (1) a source of heat, warming its environment, (2) a source of comfort, as many may gather round it as family, and (3) a source of light, the darkness is enlightened by its brilliance.

“Tongues as of fire” lighted upon the Apostles and Mary on the Feast of Pentecost... for what purpose? The Book of Numbers said... *“Whatever can stand fire – you shall put into fire, that it may become clean.”* (31:23) The fire of the Spirit was the final cleansing of the Apostles of Jesus. Their absolute purification in preparation for the work they had been called to do by the Father, in the Son, would be fulfilled through the gift of the Spirit which was promised by the Savior at the Last

Supper. Jesus said, *“I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when He comes, the Spirit of truth, He will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on His own, but He will speak what He hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming.”* (John 16:12-13) This Truth that Jesus speaks of is the truth that Jesus is the Son of God, that He was sent to suffer and die for our sins, that His suffering and death would be the avenue through which we can attain salvation, and that Jesus goes forward to this suffering and death freely, *“This is why the Father loves Me, because I lay down My life in order to take it up again,”* (John 10:17) so that we might have eternal life, *“For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.”* (John 3:17) Now that the Spirit has purified the Apostles, they are ready, as we are through the Spirit given in Confirmation, to testify to the Truth. As Jesus said, *“If you remain in My word, you will truly be My disciples and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free...”* (John 8:31-32) and *“I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.”* (John 14:6)

Our prayer should be likened to those of the Apostles, that we may be purified, that we may be enlightened, that we may be filled with the presence of the Holy Spirit and then go forth, as the Apostles on Pentecost, to spread the word and fill the world with the truth of Jesus Christ, through whom alone the world can be saved.
