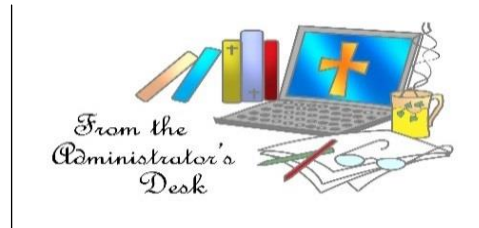

- National Vocation Awareness Week : (NVAW) is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. NVAW began in 1976 when the U. S. bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on January 13 in 2013. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November. *Almighty and eternal God, in Your unfailing love You provide ministers for Your Church. We pray for those whom You call to serve the Catholic Church as priests. Inspire in them a generous response. Grant them courage and vision to serve Your people May their lives and service call Your people to respond to the presence of Your Spirit among us that, faithful to the Gospel and hope of Jesus the Christ, we may: announce glad tidings to the poor proclaim liberty to captives, set prisoners free and renew the face of the earth.*

- Thanksgiving Food Drive: As we are in the month of November and the Thanksgiving Season, let us remember those who are less fortunate than ourselves. The parish food drive, working with our Saint Vincent DePaul Society, will be November 1-19. We are collecting nonperishable items. They can be placed into the containers located at the church entrances. All the food collected will be distributed to Saint Joseph's Food Pantry in Yonkers. We will also be collecting frozen turkeys (10-14lbs.) and hams to be distributed to the Sharing Community. We will be collecting those on Monday morning, November 20, in the parking area near the adoration chapel *Give thanks in all circumstances: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. 1 Thessalonians 5:18*

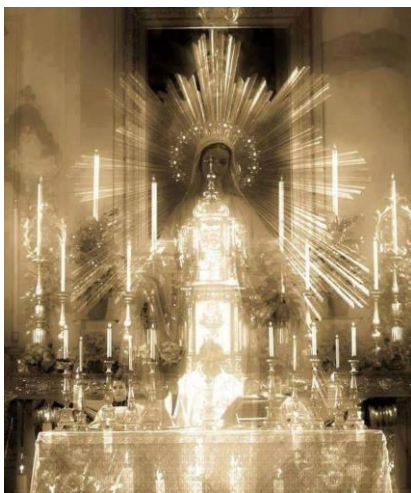

Beloved of God,

*Jesus said, "The gift you have been given, give as a gift."
(Matthew 10:8b)*



A recent television commercial showed all sorts of children doing all types of chores... that seem to be above and beyond what they would normally be willing to do. The parents are looking at the children with great surprise... and then the announcer says "Nobody wants to be on the Naughty List this year!" Christmas is all over Costco. Have you started Christmas shopping yet? Are you making plans for *Black Friday* or *Cyber Monday*? Have you heard that some stores have decided to open at 7:00PM of Thanksgiving? The pressure is beginning to mount for parents to top what was given last year and on children "to behave." The Marketing departments are in overdrive... and we will be bombarded hourly and daily for the next two months. So what are you thinking of giving?



"And Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same way, after the supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is poured out for you." (Luke 22:19-20)

The greatest gift humanity has received, besides being created by the Blessed Trinity, "then God said, "Let Us make mankind in Our image, in Our likeness," (Genesis 1:26), was the gift the Son of God, Our Savior Jesus Christ, gave us in the Blessed Sacrament... the gift of His very Self – Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – given to us at the Last Supper and through the Holy Mass. Saint Luke was inspired to remember and write the words Our Blessed Lord spoke, "Do this in remembrance of Me." Saint Matthew was also inspired by God to record in his Gospel these words of Our Savior, "The gift you have been given, give as a gift."

What better gift can you give than the Holy Mass? When people say it is the thought that counts, what better thoughts could you intend that your loved one be remembered at a Holy Mass, that the intention of the priest as he becomes one with the Holy Priest Jesus on the Cross, that your loved one be in his heart and memory? Saint Anselm said, "A single Mass offered for oneself during life may be worth more than a thousand celebrated for the same intention after death." May I offer that a single Holy Mass offered for any of your intentions, any of your loved ones, on any occasion is of untold value. It occurs to most people to have a Holy Mass offered for someone on the occasion of their going home to God. And yet, many saints, Jerome, Thomas Aquinas, Augustine, Therese, John Chrysostom, all stress the value of the Holy Mass most especially offered while the person is alive. Think about it, what good is the doctor after the patient has died. His/Her work is done. Although the Holy Mass gives untold graces to the souls for which it is offered and if they are in Purgatory will assist them along the road to finally attaining their heavenly reward... the spiritual medicine, the heavenly remedies that a Holy Mass offered for a person while alive are only bound by the limitless love and mercy of God.

So as you are considering a Christmas Gift, a Thanksgiving gift, a Birthday present, a Wedding Anniversary remembrance, a loved one who is suffering a terminal illness, a friend who is facing a life-altering decision, a Saint Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and Father's Day present, a friend or family member who is sick or stressed, or a "just-because" card, think about having a Holy Mass, with all the graces which flow from it, offered for your loved or your special intention. Turn a regular and/or special occasion into a Divine Intervention. (The parish offices will help you with this.)
