SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 10:25-26,34-5,44-48 The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out on the Gentiles also.

Psalm 98 "The Lord has revealed to the nations His saving power."

1 John 4:7-10 God is love.

John 15:9-17 No one has greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.

MEMORIAL MASS

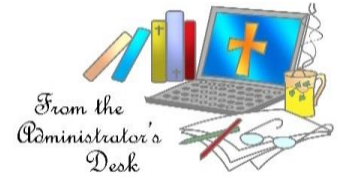

First Holy Communion: First Communion is a ceremony in which a person receives for the first time the Eucharist (Body of Christ) Congratulations to our Students from the School and Religious Education who received the sacrament of communion Saturday, May 5th. *O Jesus, who hast loved us with such exceeding great love as to give us the ineffable gift of the Holy Eucharist, inflame us with a burning zeal to promote Thy glory by preparing worthily the children who are to approach Thy holy table for the first time. Protect, O Sacred Heart of Jesus these young souls from the assaults of evil, strengthen their faith, increase their love and endow them with all the virtues that will make them worthy to receive Thee. The Cardinal's Appeal: The Cardinal Appeal is progressing. Your gift to the Appeal helps to fund many Charities to the people in our archdiocese and throughout the world. To date our parish has received \$40,702.00 in pledges and gifts towards the 2018 Cardinal's Appeal from 161 families. Our parish has 1582 registered households with multiple families living within those homes. We have received gifts from only 155 households which is 10 percent.



This appeal is extremely important to our parish and other organizations in the Archdiocese. The Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal assists our aging priests in nursing homes, works of charity, and assists our catholic schools missions and evangelization, as well as needy parishes. The goal for Saint Eugene Parish is \$96,000.00. If every household that remains gave just \$100.00 per household that would net us \$142,700.00. Every dollar that we receive over our goal is given back to the parish. Please pray about giving a gift, it can be given at once or in installments. Thank you for your consideration on this matter.

Altar Server Practice: Altar Server practice for new and experienced servers will be on Wednesday, May 9th at 4:00 in the church. We will **not have practice on Thursday** as it is Ascension Thursday, a holy day of obligation.

Ascension Thursday: Next Thursday, May 10th is Ascension Thursday. The Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord commemorates the Christian belief of the bodily Ascension of Jesus into heaven. It is one of the ecumenical feasts (i.e., universally celebrated) of Christian churches, ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and Pentecost. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter (following the accounts given in [Mark 16:19](#), [Luke 24:51](#), [Acts 1:2](#)), although some Christian denominations have moved the observance to the following Sunday. Please see the bulletin for mass times.

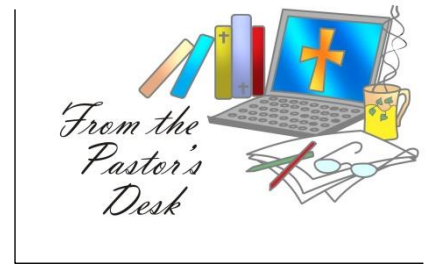

Beloved of God,

The Hail Mary... Meditation 9

“Hail Mary, Full of Grace, The Lord is with Thee. Blessed art Thou among women and blessed is the fruit of Thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of death. Amen.”



Two weeks ago, in our meditation on the Hail Mary, we learned that the Blessed Virgin, because of Her perfect humility, wished to remain *unknown*. You were also asked to question whether or not Mary was known to you? How are we supposed to begin to know a person who wishes to remain anonymous?

“Then the angel (Gabriel) departed from Her. During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where She entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary’s greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, “Most blessed are You among women, and blessed is the fruit of Your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?” (Luke 1:38b-43)

How do we get to know Mary? It is very common for us, not in humility, but in fear to “hug a wall.” When we are entering a new school, a new job, a new club, or a new parish, to sort of cower and hide... to try to remain anonymous and unknown. “If no one knows me I can just slip in and without being seen.” The proverbial... *under the radar*. There are some of us that have tried to live our whole lives like that. One might think that because we have been meditating on the *perfect humility* of Our Holy Mother that She was acting like that Herself. We take on that ghost-like role because of personal inadequacies, fears and anxieties. She never “pushed Herself forward” until after She assumed the role of Mother of God. Mary was content to live in the shadows. But once being called from worship into service, the Blessed Virgin as Holy Mother fulfilled Her role... *“Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where She entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth.”* So how do we get to know Her?

The Book of Revelation offers this familiar quote... *“Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, then I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with Me.” (3:20)* We have seen in Our Blessed Lady how eager She is as the Mother of God to visit Her cousin Elizabeth, how eager She is as the Mother of God to visit us. We have seen how Her Son reveals through His Beloved Disciple in the Book of Revelation how Jesus follows His Mother’s example and seeks us out at our homes, at the doors of our hearts... knocking, hoping we will let Him in.

Once again, how do we get to know Mary? Let the Mother of God, who has in haste come to your homes and stands outside your door bearing Her Beloved Son, in. Let Her in to your home. Let Her in to your heart. And know that where She goes, She brings the Saviour.
