Psalm 93 "The Lord is King: He is robed in majesty."

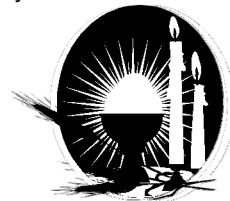
Revelation 1: 5-8 The ruler of the kings of the earth has made us into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father.

NEW HOLY MASS SCHEDULE

Thank you to all those who filled out the Holy Mass Survey. There were a total of 167 surveys returned out of 800 printed. That's more than 20%. Recall what the options were...

- Sunday 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am... 52 votes
- Sunday 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 12:00 pm... 109 votes
- Sunday 5:00 pm... 77 votes
- Sunday 6:00 pm... 69 votes

So, based on your voting and looking at the surrounding parishes the new Sunday Holy Mass Schedule will be the following...

- Sunday 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 12:00 pm and
- Sunday 6:00pm

The reasons the Sunday Evening Holy Mass stayed the same were three...

1. The established schedule people are used to is 6:00 pm,
2. The two times were only 8 votes apart,
3. St. Bartholomew, Yonkers, already has a 5:00 pm and Sacred Heart, Hartsdale, has a 7:00 pm. Keeping St. Eugene's at 6:00 pm will be able to serve the greatest number of parishioners and other faithful.

Thank you for participating in this process. The Daily Holy Mass will remain the same. The Holy Day of Obligation Holy Mass Schedule is listed on the front of the bulletin.

The possibility of a Latin Mass/Mass of the Extraordinary Form on Sunday afternoons is being investigated.

The Mass Book will be opened following the First Sunday of Advent. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

**By the President of the United States of America.
A Proclamation.**

“The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequalled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to foreign States to invite and to provoke their aggression, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed except in the theatre of military conflict; while that theatre has been greatly contracted by the advancing armies and navies of the Union. Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense, have not arrested the plough, the shuttle or the ship; the axe has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battle-field; and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect of years with large increase of freedom. No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American People. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father dwelleth in the Heavens. And I recommend to them that while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union.”

“In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the United States to be affixed. Done at the City of Washington, this Third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty-eighth.”

Beloved of God,

There were many other “Thanksgivings” ordered and celebrated: 1621 with the Pilgrims, 1676 by the governing council of Charlestown, Massachusetts, 1789 by President George Washington. For varied reasons celebrated, and yet remarkably proclaimed is the necessity of gathering for a day *“of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father dwelleth in the Heavens...”* (Lincoln) and *“a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God.”* (Washington) *Our Nation was founded with God in mind and as a driving force to be incorporated into our daily lives. As we gather this “Thanksgiving” let us hear the words spoken by our Founding Forefathers and open our hearts and daily lives to the “ever watchful providence of Almighty God.”* (Lincoln) We need God more now than ever in Government, in the Economy, in Society, in our Homes, in our Families and in our Daily Lives.
