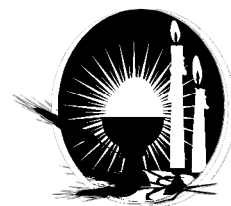
FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

NEW HOLY MASS SCHEDULE

Thank you to all those who filled out the Holy Mass Survey. There were a total of 167 surveys returned out of 800 printed. That's more than 20%. Recall what the options were...

- Sunday 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am... 52 votes
- Sunday 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 12:00 pm... 109 votes
- Sunday 5:00 pm... 77 votes
- Sunday 6:00 pm... 69 votes

So, based on your voting and looking at the surrounding parishes the new Sunday Holy Mass Schedule will be the following...

- Sunday 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 12:00 pm and
- Sunday 6:00pm

The reasons the Sunday Evening Holy Mass stayed the same were three...

1. The established schedule people are used to is 6:00 pm,
2. The two times were only 8 votes apart,
3. St. Bartholomew, Yonkers, already has a 5:00 pm and Sacred Heart, Hartsdale, has a 7:00 pm. Keeping St. Eugene's at 6:00 pm will be able to serve the greatest number of parishioners and other faithful.

Thank you for participating in this process. The Daily Holy Mass will remain the same. The Holy Day of Obligation Holy Mass Schedule is listed on the front of the bulletin.

The possibility of a Latin Mass/Mass of the Extraordinary Form on Sunday afternoons is being investigated.

The Mass Book will be opened following the First Sunday of Advent. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Dear Parishioners:

Advent: This Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent is a lovely spiritual season. With the beginning of the season of Advent, we begin a new liturgical year. The First Sunday of Advent is therefore the Church's "New Year's Day". In the Judeo-Christian tradition, Sunday begins at sundown of the day before when the faithful celebrate First Vespers. Advent begins the Christmas cycle. Advent comes from the Latin word for an "arrival" or a "coming". Advent means that the Lord is coming. Jesus Christ, our brother in our humanity and our God in His divinity is about to arrive. But He comes to us in different ways. First, Jesus came to us at a specific point in history at Bethlehem about 2000 years ago. But in the Church's great feast of Christmas He mystically comes again. Second, the Lord, Alpha and Omega, will come to judge the living and the dead in the Second Coming. Third, the Redeemer comes to us in grace. He speaks to us in our consciences; He comes to us in the Eucharist and in the Word of God proclaimed. He arrives in the person of the beggar, the needy, the suffering, and the oppressed. We must be ready to receive and welcome Him when He comes.

Prayer for the Advent Wreath O God by whose word all things are sanctified pour forth thy blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ, and may receive from thee abundant graces, through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

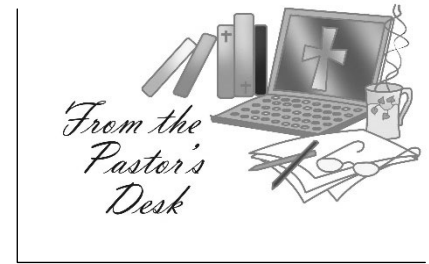

We await the Savior
EMMANUEL

Beloved of God,

First Sunday of Advent

“On the first of each month you shall offer as a holocaust to the LORD two bullocks, one ram, and seven unblemished yearling lambs, with three tenths of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil as the cereal offering for each bullock, two tenths of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil as the cereal offering for the ram, and one tenth of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil as the cereal offering for each lamb, that the holocaust may be a sweet-smelling oblation to the LORD. Their libations shall be half a hin of wine for each bullock, a third of a hin for the ram, and a fourth of a hin for each lamb. This is the new moon holocaust for every new moon of the year. Moreover, one goat shall be sacrificed as a sin offering to the LORD. These are to be offered in addition to the established holocaust and its libation.” (Numbers 28:11-15)

In all the Scriptures, Old or New Testament, there is only one verse that contains the words “new” and “year.” It is within the Book of Numbers, chapter 28, verse 14. Chapter 28 reveals a conversation between God and Moses where God is telling Moses how the people are to dedicate various days and weeks during the year to worship of the Almighty Who has freed them from slavery. The Oblations (you may recognize this word from our own recent translation of the Roman Missal. It means “the offering of a gift or sacrifice to a deity and the offering of bread and wine to God during the Christian service of Communion.”) are to be offered each Morning and Evening, on the Sabbath, at the New Moon, at Passover and at Pentecost. The Day is supposed to begin and end in showing reverence to God. The year is supposed to begin the same way with various days during the year (Passover and Pentecost) also being dedicated to the Almighty. The Jewish people did this by taking the very best fruits of their crops, labor or herds and sacrificing them to God. Giving the best of what you have, not leftovers or from your surplus, is what God intended as explained in the Passage of the *Widow’s Mite*... “(Jesus said) for those others have all made offerings from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has offered her whole livelihood.” (Luke 21:4)

This Advent Season is a new beginning offered to us each year by our Holy Mother, the Church. She, by listening to God’s revealed word in the Holy Scriptures and the teaching of Her Groom, Jesus the Christ, continues to echo through Her practices the intentions of God Father, Son and Holy Spirit... of having the people of God grow to see the importance of having God’s presence pervade their lives.

We too easily and too quickly compartmentalize God, restricting Him to an hour on Sunday, a Morning or Evening offering, Night prayers, or when we want something. Some of us even might say, “How much more does God want from me?” How about a comparison... How many hours do you dedicate to God during the week? – verses – How many hours do you *work*, do you *sleep*, do you *watch television*, do you *drink*, do you *eat*, do you *talk* with others, do you *read* the papers or books, how many hours are you on the *internet*?

As we enter this most holy Season of Advent, where we should be first preparing for the Second Coming of Jesus Christ in all His glory and then recalling Our Lord’s First Coming as the Infant Jesus who was born to die for us, let us make an effort to truly make God a greater part of our day and hopefully, the most important part of our lives on a daily basis.
