Psalm 84 "Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord."


1 John 3:1-2, 21-24 We are God's children now.



My Dear Friends in Christ,

Meditations on the Feast of the Holy Family

“Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.” All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: “Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,” which means, “God is with us.”
(Matthew 1:18-23)



The planes will be arriving soon. Taxis will be filled with travelers seeking to fulfill the WWII prophecy of “I’ll be home for Christmas.” Sleeping arrangements have been modified to account for the new arrivals. The once empty nest will not only be filled again, but will be overflowing. The churches will be filled with those coming to worship their Lord and their extended families who will gather around the table and hearth and more importantly the table of the Lord and the heart of the Savior. The level of joy is rising as this will soon come to pass.

When we get together, how would you describe the gathering? Some may say controlled chaos... as the children are all about, some overdosing on sugar and sweets, some overdosing on presents, some asleep after the exhaustion of the unwrapping has taken over and the adrenaline of anticipation has worn off. (We all know they are not sleeping... but recharging.) Some may say just chaos... completely disorganized, everybody going in different directions, there is no real meal time or present time, just a constant buzz, low or high murmur of voices filled with excitement and constant greetings and exhilaration after the opening of more and more presents. Some may say, “It was a quiet Christmas...,” the children and grandchildren are all over the country and the cost of getting together was exorbitant, the traffic is too much on the day so we all stayed local, this year was the one for the in-laws, all my family and friends have gone home to God, so “It was just me.” No matter your experience, we should all have one thing in common. No, not the presents, not the tree, not the food, not the cards, not the ribbons or presents, not the family or friends, not even the Nativity scene on display. What do you think it should be? Reread the passage from Matthew’s Gospel again...

The Prophet Isaiah had prophesied more than 700 years before the writing of the Gospel author that “*the virgin shall conceive and bear a son,*” that the salvific plan of the Almighty involved the Son of God taking humanity upon Himself, put not only taking on humanity, but even further... “*being born,*” and even more significant than that... “*being born into a family.*” It is within that family church we find “*God is with us.*” God was born unto and within a family to consecrate and create a sacred unity... to make the family holy.

Whether during the Christmas season or just a regular day during the year... could you say that your family is holy? Could you say that you that Christ is a part of your family? Since we see ourselves quite frequently through rose-colored glasses, would others say that your family is holy... that “*God is with your family?*”

Through the intercession of the Holy Family... may we make every effort to find a place for God in our families.
