Psalms 96 "Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations."

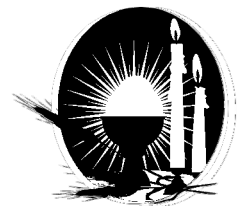
1 Corinthians 12:4-11 The Spirit distributes gifts to each person.

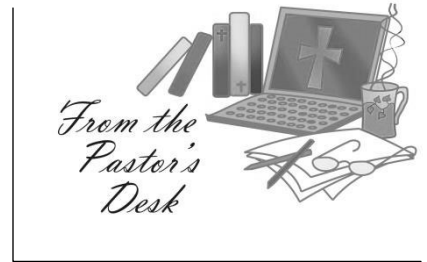

Beloved of God,

Raffles to the left of me... Raffles to the right of me.

Upon arriving in August, and then when the Archdiocesan Audit was in full swing, the topic of the Raffles at Saint Eugene were brought to the fore. You may recall that there were three raffles here during the year... 1. The Spring Raffle,

2. The Christmas Raffle, and
3. The Fundraiser Club.



The Fundraiser Club... There is a formula that makes this a successful means of raising money for the parish of a necessary number of participants multiplied by the cost of the tickets. The cost of tickets for the past year was \$26. In order for the parish have broken even or made some money, there would have to have been no less than 300 participants or tickets in the pot to be available for the weekly pull. Because there less than 190 participants, the parish was operating this at a loss from the outset. Also, because all participants acted in good faith, we had to continue the raffle to its completion with the grand winners pulled before Christmas. All the winners have been notified. However, because the number of participants was so dramatically low, this *wasn't a fundraiser* at all for the parish. The Fundraiser Club cost the parish \$4,864. Because of this loss, the parish will no longer have the Fundraiser Club at this time. Other means of fundraising, most especially cost cutting, are being investigated.

The Spring Raffle and the Christmas Raffle... These two fundraisers were run by the same raffle manager for the last eight years. The process was he would send out envelopes that had a letter of explanation and raffle tickets to a mailing list we provided. He would come to the offices on a weekly basis and personally open all envelopes the parish received. Based on the totals from those envelopes for that week, a check would be immediately written to him personally. The raffle manager would make 30% of all monies left after winnings were paid out and expenses. Of all your donations for tickets sold, the parish would typically make 50% of the total collected. So this was a fundraiser for the parish. There were, however, a number of other issues - complications.

It took Ms Mastrangelo and I a bit of digging. We first started by “googling” the corporation which was listed on the papers in the “raffle file.” There was no record of any such corporation. We and the Archdiocesan Auditors were not only wondering why checks were being written to raffle manager instead of the raffle corporation but officially recommended that all ties be served with him.

Further, just as New York State has gaming rules with necessary permits that must be issued at a fee, because we are residents of Yonkers, and Yonkers has the Empire Casino at Yonkers Raceway, Yonkers has its own gaming rules as well. Ms Mastrangelo found all the gaming rules and regulations on line, which are quite extensive with the associated fees for any and all fundraisers. After we read them (and they governed all three raffles here at Saint Eugene), I called the raffle manager back, leaving him a message requesting his Certificate of Incorporation and wanting to know if he was registered with the Yonkers Gaming Association. Two days after my phone call, the raffle manager called me back to let me know, “I’m getting old, so I’ve decided to retire... after all Yonkers would go back all eight years.” Does anything else need to be said?

Ms Mastrangelo and I will be looking into other fundraisers for the parish, but the parish first and foremost is supported by you, her parishioners. Thank you for your generosity.
