Psalm 95 "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."

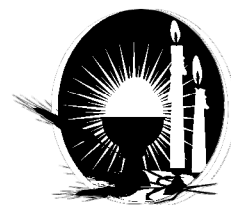
Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 God's love is poured into our hearts in the gift of the Spirit.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence: During the Season of Lent, the Church urges all Faithful to reflect a spirit in penance in their daily life through performing acts of fast and abstinence.

Fasting requires that only one full meal be taken per day. Two other smaller meals may be taken during the day to maintain physical strength, but these two meals together should not equal a full meal in quantity. Fasting obliges all those who have reached the age of 18 and continues to oblige until age 59. Those not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

Abstinence prohibits individuals from eating a meat on a particular day. Abstinence obliges all those who have reached the age of 14 and continues to oblige throughout their entire life. Those not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in the discipline to the extent that they are able.

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are **days of fast and abstinence**. **Fridays** in Lent are days of **abstinence**.

Lenten Novena: Father, all powerful and ever-living God, during this Holy Season of Lent You call us to a closer union with Yourself. Help us to prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery with mind and heart renewed. Give us a spirit of loving service to our neighbors. As we recall the great events that gave us new life in Christ, bring the image of Your Son to perfection within our souls. This great season of grace is Your gift to Your family to renew us in spirit. Give us the strength to purify our hearts, to control our desires, and so to serve You in freedom. Teach us how to live in this passing world with our hearts set on the world that will never end.... We ask for the grace to master our sinfulness and conquer our pride. We want to show to those in need Your goodness to us by being kind to all. Through our observances of Lent help us to correct our faults and raise our minds to You, and thus grow in holiness that we may deserve the reward of everlasting life. In Your mercy grant us this special favor. (**Mention your request**) The days of the life-giving Death and glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ, Your Son, is approaching. This is the hour when he triumphed over Satan's pride, the time when we celebrate the great event of our Redemption, the Suffering and Death of Your Son brought to life to the whole world, moving our hearts to praise Your glory. The power of the Cross reveals Your judgement on this world and the kingship of Christ crucified. Father through His love for us and through His sufferings, Death and Resurrection, may we gain eternal life with You in heaven.

They have many beautiful pieces that can be given as gifts or just to adorn your home or office. They will be located in the hallway on the school entrance side.

Inclement Weather: Just a reminder, if there is any form of winter precipitation that should occur on Wednesday afternoons or evenings, which may interfere with Religious Education, or safety on the roads, please watch news 12 for cancellations.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Next, Saturday, March 5th our second grade children and older children in our religious education program as well as the children from our school will be receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation. The children with the guidance of their parents and teachers, are studying very hard as they prepare for Penance, and First Holy Communion. Please keep them and their families in your prayers.

Religious Education Lenten Project: Lent is the season of preparation for Easter. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Spy Wednesday, lasting for 40 days. We prepare for Easter by fasting and practicing spiritual discipline during this time, to reflect on his sacrifices. Basically, Lent is a time for "Spring Cleaning" our lives while giving thanks to God and strengthening our relationship with him. 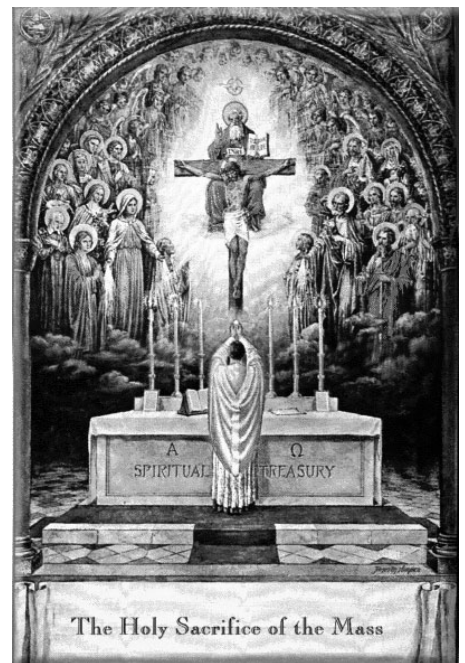
Beloved of God,

Saint Paul wrote...*“Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother, to the church of God that is in Corinth, to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, **called to be holy**, with all those everywhere who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours. Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.”* (1Corinthians 1:1-3)



In trying to understand our call to holiness, or the process of becoming holy, perhaps Archbishop Fulton Sheen could offer some insight. In his book *The Priest Is Not His Own*, he wrote *“God is holy; that holiness comes to earth in Christ. Christ bestows it on His priests with their cooperation; they, in the measure in which they accept, contribute to making the people holy.”* (p.73) Holiness, much like the rain and snow over the past few weeks, comes down from up above. The process explained by Fulton Sheen establishes that no matter what... *God is holy*, implying as well the Son of God is holy. The miracle of the Incarnation, the Son of God being born of Mary, is how *holiness comes to earth*. Christ being truly Divine and truly Human reestablishes holiness in humanity... and yet at the same time limited to Himself. By instituting the Sacred Priesthood on Holy Thursday at the Last Supper, *Christ bestows it on His priests*. The priests, though, are not forced to be holy or poof, like magic, are suddenly holy. They have to *cooperate* with the gift of the Sacred Priesthood, they have to *cooperate* with the Giver of Jesus’ Sacred Priesthood. The priests have to assume the mission of Christ in *bringing holiness to the earth*. As Saint Matthew has said in Chapter 10 verses 8b and following, *“The gift you have been given, give as a gift.”* The Sacred Priesthood of Jesus Christ does not belong to the priest. The Sacred Priesthood of Jesus Christ is given to the priest so that the priest can continue to fulfill the mission of the Son of God in contributing to the process of *holiness coming to the earth in Christ*.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen also said, *“as the shepherd, so the sheep; as the priest, so the people.”* And again, *“every worldly priest hinders the growth of the Church, every saintly priest promotes it.”* (p.7-67) All the priests given to you at Saint Eugene parish have had the privilege of being incorporated into the One Sacred Priesthood of Jesus Christ with the commission by the One True Priest, Jesus Christ, to be holy himself and with the grace of the Son of God in living his priesthood *cooperating* with the holiness given him by Jesus Christ, helping the people to grow in holiness... *“as the shepherd, so the sheep; as the priest, so the people.”* We, like all of you, are imperfect beings who are trying to *“be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect.”* (Matthew 5:48) So that we priests may *accept, cooperate* and imitate Christ as Priest and Victim (suffering and dying for His people), please pray for us. Just as there is the descent of holiness from above *“there is simultaneously an ascending movement of holiness from the Christian Community to the All-Holy God.”* (p.79) Although, so much does depend upon us priests, Saint Paul wrote in his letter to the Corinthians, *“to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, (to you who have been) called to be holy.”* We all have the calling to be holy. Let us pray for each other. May we grow in holiness together.
