

"There is something happening."

This past Sunday, Saint Eugene parish was gifted with the presence of the Holy Spirit. The Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, whom Jesus promised He would send, (John 14:26, 15:26), descended upon the 43 young people who had prepared themselves through years of preparation in class, prayer



and community service, to open their hearts to not only the Gift of the Holy Spirit Himself, but the seven gifts which the Spirit bestows. We remember them as Fortitude, Counsel, Knowledge, Understanding, Wisdom, Piety and Fear of the Lord. What a glorious day, weather-wise... what a divine day caught up in the presence of Almighty God.



It is important, though, that we not only limit the workings of the Spirit to the purely Sacramental. Recall, that I said how much these young parishioners had done in preparation. But did they prepare alone? Firstly, the parents of these souls had the gift of faith in their hearts to originally present them to God in Baptism and continue their learning about God through daily prayers taught at home and then either at school or religious education. Parents, without you, yesterday's explosion of the Spirit would not have been possible. Secondly, all the educators who participated in the our young ones religious formation had and continue to play such an important role, as they not only in religion class but throughout the day and after school, foster a sense of faith in the

environment where the children learn. As we speak, so should we do. Lastly, all the clergy and religious who have been a part of the spiritual formation of our parish continue to leave their mark as in God's grace the seeds that were planted by them, and nurtured by God, are reaping 100, 50 and 30 fold before our eyes.

What do I mean? One of the lessons we offer the young ones as they are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, which Bishop Gerald Walsh referred to as well, is that Confirmation is not Graduation. Meaning, they and all of us, as adults now in the faith having been fully initiated into the Faith, are just beginning our life in Christ and His Holy Catholic Church. So we are to use those gifts given by God in the Sacrament throughout our daily lives. But let us be clear. The gifts of the Spirit are not limited to those receiving or having received the Sacrament of Confirmation. All we have to do is look around to see where the fruits of the Spirit are. The Fruits... yes, the fruits. The effects of the Spirit. The Gifts are those given by God. The Fruits are what happens because the Spirit is present and working in and through us.



Last Wednesday, one of the 7TH Grade Religious Education classes put on a play. They asked if they could do it. They had prepared for a number of weeks. They had learned their lines. They even arranged for modest costumes. It wasn't long – maybe 15 minutes... but it was powerful. A few had many lines to learn and some only a few... but all participated and supported each other. When they had finished, all of us were deeply moved, the 7th Graders, the 6th graders who watched, Fr. Anthony, Ms. Mastrangelo and I. So much so, that I had to tell you about it. These 12 year old children asked if they could put on The Passion Play. You know, the Gospel we read together on Palm Sunday and Good Friday. The Trial of Jesus. The Last Supper. The Garden of Gethsemane. The Betrayal by Judas. The Court of Pontius Pilate. I have read the Passion for years. Meditated on it as well. But this simple, heartfelt rendition offered by the future of our parish and our Church, not only touched me... but gave me Hope. The Spirit is Alive and Thriving in the Parish of Saint Eugene. Let us continue through all our efforts to use those gifts given to us and let the fruits of the Spirit show that we are people of faith.
