




- **Feast of the Exultation of the Cross:** The Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross, celebrated every year on September 14, recalls three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulcher and Mount Calvary; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II. But in a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the life-giving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin when he ate from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the Garden of Eden. *O God who willed that Your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant that we who have known His mystery on earth may merit the grace of His redemption in heaven, through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit on God, forever and ever. Amen. –from the USCCB.*

THE BIRTH OF OUR BLESSED MOTHER – September 8th
THE TRAGEDY OF 9/11 – September 11th
THE TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS – September 14th



“Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord. (Simeon) came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to Him, he took Him into his arms and blessed God, saying: “Now, Master, You may let Your servant go in peace, according to Your word, for my eyes have seen Your salvation, which You prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for Your people Israel.” The Child’s father and mother were amazed at what was said about Him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother, “Behold, this Child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted and you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.” (Luke 2:25-35)

It has long been the tradition of the Catholic Church found in Her Sacred Calendar of Solemnities, Feasts and Memorials of Saints and Sacred Events (Christmas/Easter), that the holy people of God are to call to mind and incorporate into the movement of their day the *Birth of the Mother of God*, September 8th, and the *Triumph of the Cross*, September 14th. (The reason the Birth of Holy Mary is celebrated on September 8th is because it is exactly 9 months after Her *Immaculate Conception* which is celebrated on December 8th.) Within the space of a week, the Holy Church has given us the beginning of Divine Intervention in Salvation History where *“With us is God,”* (Isaiah 8:10, Matthew 1:23) to its culmination Our Savior offering Himself on the Cross of Life, *“It is finished.”* (John 19:30) This one week has captured the essence and fullness of the Love and Mercy of Almighty God. In His great love, God, Who had sent numerous prophets and judges to remind His Chosen People of Himself while at the same time drawing them back to Himself after their wandering. In His mercy, God, each time they wandered, opened His arms to His wayward flock to Shepherd them home. While these attempts were full of His love and mercy, they were not fully received by His people. So *“when the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law so that we might receive adoption.”* (Galatians 4:4-5) The Son of God, becoming Human at the Incarnation, became the first of many Sons and Daughters to be welcomed into the family of the Almighty, either as His Chosen Ones or as His Adopted Sons and Daughters.

And of course, there must be a Mother... *“Standing by the cross of Jesus were His Mother and His Mother’s sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw His Mother and the disciple there whom He loved, He said to His Mother, “Woman, behold your Son.” Then He said to the disciple, “Behold, your Mother.”* (John 19:25-26) Mary, as Jesus Mother, is Queen of Heaven. Mary, as our Mother through the gift of Her to John the Beloved Disciple, is Queen of Earth. And as our Mother, She has never left us. She is away of the great suffering we are enduring. Her Immaculate (free of sin) Heart hurts for all of us, Her children. We know this because of the numerous times Our Beloved Holy Mother has revealed Herself to us throughout history... Our Lady of Guadalupe and Our Lady of Fatima, to name a couple. In her revelations, She tells us of Her knowing our pain and She offers us remedies... most especially prayers – ever dear to Her Heart is the Holy Rosary. And any true apparition always carries with it a message where Our Lady points us not to Herself but to Her Son. In Her own words, She asked the children of Fatima to add the following phrase to the Holy Rosary... *“O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those most in need of Your mercy.”*

So when the Evil One chose September 11th, 9/11 or 911, hoping to send a message of despair, destruction, domination and fear tied to known distress call 911, it placed this day of horror between the Author of Life Being Born of the New Mother of Creation and the Conquering of Sin and Death with the Gift of Life Eternal Through the Cross of Christ. Please listen to the words of Our Lady of Fatima again... *“O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those most in need of Your mercy.”* As we recall September 11, please pray this prayer repeatedly. It applies to that day because Jesus and Mary were there. As you wake in the every morning, please offer this holy prayer. Before you lay down your head every night, please offer this holy prayer. *“O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those most in need of Your mercy.”*
