

MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD AND THE NEED FOR PEACE

Every January 1 we celebrate the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, and at the same time, celebrate the World Day of Peace. The Blessed Mother remains at the heart of our peace, for she alone was the instrument chosen to bring the Son of God into this world. She alone is the one who best teaches us how to draw closer to Christ, the Prince of Peace.

A famous quote from St. Augustine reminds us: "Peace is not the absence of war, but the tranquility of order." This "tranquility of order" is not simply nation to nation but the "tranquility of order" within myself: my heart, my mind, my body, my soul. Mary helps each one of us to be ordered to Christ, who alone is our lasting peace, even in times of great warfare, whether it be international or internal.

January 1st Solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God



On New Year's Day, the octave day of Christmas, the church celebrates the Solemnity of the Holy Mother of God, the divine and virginal motherhood of the Blessed Virgin. It is the highest title of the Blessed Virgin Mary; Mother of God. This title was given to Mary at the council of Ephesus in 431 AD. The council taught, however, that the humanity and divinity of Jesus could not be separated and that they exist in one person, with the momentous implication that we can rightly give Mary the title of Mother of God. Mother brings life, a gift from God into the world. That's why you sometimes hear the Church referred to as "Mother". The Evangelist, Luke, describes her as the silent Virgin who listens constantly to the Eternal Word, who lives in the Word of God. The feast is the celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus and is the oldest feast of Mary celebrated by the Catholic Church. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel. (Luke 1:26-38) Elizabeth proclaims; "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are You who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God, my Savior.

Heavenly Father, You blessed the Virgin Mary with fullness of grace. She is model of faith, hope and love. I give this New Year to her intercession and ask for her holy prayers. Place my needs into the protection of her motherly love. With her help, I want my faith to grow. Give me an increase in the virtue of hope when troubles tempt me to despair. Guide me in understanding Your infinite love. And join my heart, dear Lord, to the Holy Mother's Immaculate Heart, so that I may improve in loving everyone unconditionally, in imitation of my Savior, Jesus. Amen.

May Mary the Mother of God be with us all today and always, a blessed New Year to all of you!



Eucharist Heart of Jesus Litany – Part 2

“Heart of Jesus in the Eucharist, sweet companion of our exile, I adore You.”

Heart of Jesus! The Litany we are meditating on has the invocations begin with “The Heart of Jesus...” over and over. Before we can begin to delve into the petitions we are offering, we must first delve into the mystery of the “Heart of Jesus.”



The first time the word *heart* is used in our Sacred Scriptures is in the Book of Genesis. Of course, we must turn to the Sacred Scriptures to understand God, because it is through them that the Almighty has spent human history revealing Himself. Sacred Scripture is Salvation History. You may find this quote most curious...

“When the Lord saw how great the wickedness of human beings was on earth, and how every desire that their heart conceived was always nothing but evil, the Lord regretted making human beings on the earth, and His heart was grieved.” (Genesis 6:5)

It is important to note that the first reference of “heart,” whether the human heart or the Divine Heart, was in speaking of “*how every desire that (the human beings) heart conceived was always nothing but evil.*” This is in such contrast to how human beings were created – “*God created mankind in His image; in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them...*” (Genesis 1:27) and “*the Lord God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.*” (Genesis 2:7) Humanity was conceived and created in the image of the Divine. So the Heart of the Divine One was reflected in the heart of humanity. This is even more evident that when we were created from the dust of the ground we were lifeless beings. We were without breath. The first breath of humanity was offered from the Divine. Our life’s breath came from God. Our hearts were to mirror our Creators. We know though what happened...

“Now the snake was the most cunning of all the wild animals that the LORD God had made. He asked the woman, ‘Did God really say, ‘You shall not eat from any of the trees in the garden?’” The woman answered the snake: “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, ‘You shall not eat it or even touch it, or else you will die.’” But the snake said to the woman: “You certainly will not die! God knows well that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, who know good and evil.” The woman saw that the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eyes, and the tree was desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loin cloths for themselves.” (Genesis 3:1-7)

Being cast from the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve had to struggle the rest of their lives for the food as part of their punishment. Very quickly Jealousy and Greed, relatives to the Pride revealed in the Arrogant sin of our first parents, drove humanity to the most base of crimes...

“Cain said to his brother Abel, “Let us go out in the field.” When they were in the field, Cain attacked his brother Abel and killed him. Then the Lord asked Cain, where is your brother Abel? He answered, “I do not know. Am I my brother’s keeper?” God then said: What have you done? Your brother’s blood cries out to Me from the ground!” (Genesis 4:10)

Oh, how lost humanity was. Oh, how quickly humanity fell. Oh, how hard humanity fell. When we were created in the Divine Image, all we needed to do was obey the Divine One... all we needed to do was to listen to the Divine Heart implanted within us... and breathe the breath of Divine Life given us.
