## EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

**Isaiah 60:1-6** The Glory of the Lord shines on all people.

**Psalm 72** "Lord, every nation on earth will adore You."

**Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6** God's secret plan is revealed.

**Matthew 2:1-12** They presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

The refrain for our responsorial psalm sets the tone for today's readings: "Lord, every nation on earth will adorn You." Saint Paul takes up the message: the Gentiles are co-heirs and copartners in the promise. Isaiah proclaims that "nations shall walk by your light." Did the Magi come all the way just to see a little baby? No, they came to see the salvation of the whole world. Let us allow these readings today to broaden our horizons so that we see God everywhere, and learn to show God to everyone in our lives.

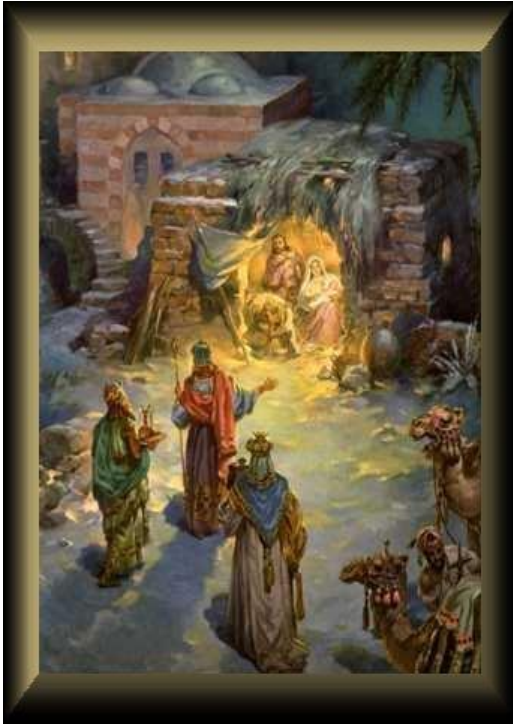

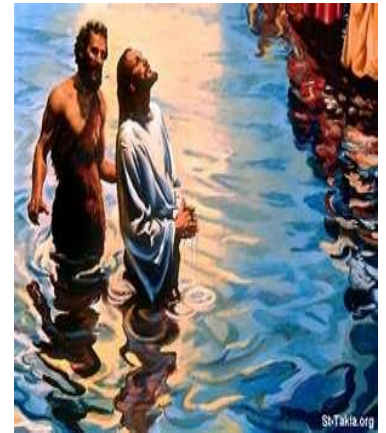
these petitions in the name of your Son, who has truly revealed your heart. Amen.

The olive wood carving market is the major source of income in the Bethlehem area. More than 65 percent of the income of the community in Bethlehem comes from this work. 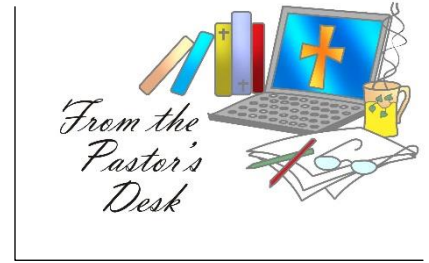

### Meditations on the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

*“Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, ‘Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found Him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay Him homage.’ When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary His mother; and they knelt down and paid Him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.” (Matthew 2:7-12)*



Somewhere along the way they met up. They were scientists from a variety of countries. Remember, we do not know how many there were. We assume there were three because three gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh were mentioned. The scriptures refer to them as “wise men.” These men of studies, probably knew each other or knew of each other, scientists or those of similar backgrounds usually do. Having studied the skies, having seen the anomaly of this *new star*, having seen that this *new star* not only appear but seemed to be moving across the sky, they, in their different countries, were drawn to it. And somewhere along their trip of months to years, they met up with each other. Imagine those first meetings. Of course, there were introductions, there were comparisons of notes concerning *the star*, there were the wanderings of thoughts as to what *this star* might mean, there were deep intellectual conversations because they were “wise men” or men of studies about the worlds history’s, philosophy’s, biology’s and astronomy’s that each of them possessed. Yet, no matter what they were discussing, it all came back to or originated with *the star*. And so they were wandering together. More correctly, they were being led together... by *the star*.

*“Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, ‘I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.’” (John 8:12)*

We at times limit Jesus and His life to thirty-three years... from the Incarnation (the Birth of the Divine Son of God) to His Resurrection from the dead. But, because Jesus is the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, and because of Jesus’ raising Himself from the dead, we are not dealing here with a mere mortal bound by limited years of existence. We are caught up in the mystery of the Divine One, existing before Mary and Joseph, existing before Moses and Abraham, existing before and outside of time, present with us to this day and until the end of time and beyond. This Divine One, Our Beloved God, did not just manifest Himself at the time of Mary and Joseph through the birth of the Infant Jesus. God revealed Himself through *the star* which was present for all to see and all to follow (although only a few did). God revealed Himself through the prophets of old, through the patriarchs and matriarchs of our faith, through the saints in heaven, the holy ones of these ages and the most blessed gift of Holy Mother Church. As Jesus said, *“I am the light of the world.”* Ever since the fall, ever since the sin of our first parents, God has been illuminating the darkness of our sin with the light of His grace. God has been reaching out to us to bring us back into the light of His presence and away from the evil one. After so many attempts to have us return, from Noah through Moses, we could only be saved through this most dramatic act of *the Light of World* becoming the *Light in the World*. With Jesus, now ever-present among us through His teachings, through His Holy Church, through most especially His presence which can only be found in the Eucharist of the Catholic Church, more and more people will be drawn to the truth and presence of God in the Catholic Church as the “wise men” once were so many generations ago... as long as their hearts and minds are open to the Light of World, Jesus Savior.
