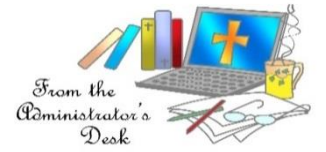

Dear Parishioners:

World Day of Prayer for Vocations: Today, May 7, 2017 is the 54th anniversary of the World Day of Prayers for Vocations. The purpose of the day is to publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his Harvest (Mt 9:38, Lk 10:2) As a climax to the prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries; *priesthood and diaconate*, to the Religious Life in all its forms male & female, contemplative and apostolic, to societies of apostolic life, to secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life, in the particular sense of mission. "Ad Gentes" (which is Latin for "To the Nations," and is from the first line of the decree, as is customary with **Roman Catholic** documents) *from the USCCB*.



Our Lady of Fatima, May 13th 100 years: The famous apparitions of the Virgin Mary to the children of Fatima took place during the First World War, in the summer of 1917. The inhabitants of this tiny village in the diocese of Leiria (Portugal) were mostly poor people, many of them small farmers who went out by day to tend their fields and animals. Children traditionally were assigned the task of herding the sheep. The three children who received the apparitions had been brought up



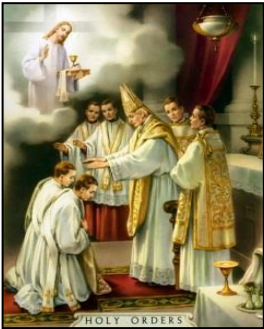
in an atmosphere of genuine piety: Lucia dos Santos (ten years old) and her two younger cousins, Francisco and Jacinta. Together they tended the sheep and, with Lucy in charge, would often pray the Rosary kneeling in the open. In the summer of 1916 an Angel appeared to them several times and taught them a prayer to the Blessed Trinity. On



Sunday, May 13, 1917, toward noon, a flash of lightning drew the attention of the children, and they saw a brilliant figure appearing over the trees of the Cova da Iria. The "Lady" asked them to pray for the conversion of sinners and an end to the war, and to come back every month, on the 13th. Further apparitions took place on June 13 and July 13. On August 13 the children were prevented by local authorities from going to the Cova da Iria, but they saw the apparition on the 19th. On September 13 the Lady requested recitation of the Rosary for an end to the war. Finally, on October 13, the "Lady" identified herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary" and again called for prayer and penitence. On that day a celestial phenomenon also took place: the sun seemed to tumble from the sky and crash toward earth. The children

had been forewarned of it as early as May 13, the first apparition. The large crowd (estimated at 30,000 by reporters) that had gathered around the children saw the phenomenon and came away astounded. Official recognition of the "visions" which the children had at the Cova da Iria came on October 13, 1930, when the bishop of Leiria - after long inquiry - authorized the cult of Our Lady of the Rosary at the site. The two younger children had died: Francisco (who saw the apparition but did not hear the words) on April 4, 1919, and his sister Jacinta on February 20, 1920. Sister Lucia died on February 13, 2005, at her Carmelite convent in Coimbra, Portugal, after a long illness. *From the USCCB*

Father Fernan was ordained May 13, 1989 by John Cardinal O'Connor. Just as Father Fernan is there to anoint the dying, grant that he will receive the same grace at his death. We beg You, Jesus, that this holy priest will be protected from all spiritual and temporal attacks and that his fidelity to the Church and his faith in You will endure, unwavering, until the end. 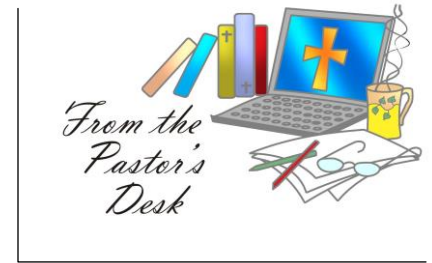

Beloved of God,

The Month of May being dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, Mary



“During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where She entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in Her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, “Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled.” And Mary said: “My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.” (Luke 1:39-47)

“I'm the Mother of God!” “I'm the Mother of God!” “God chose me!” “I'm special!” “Look at me, I'm the Mother of God!” “Bow down and worship me!”

These are things that Mary *did not* say. The first words spoken by Our Blessed Lady upon Her visit to Her cousin Elizabeth point to *“the greatness of God”* and *“rejoic(ing) in God.”* Our Blessed Mother, like Moses who was tempted to let God destroy the Jewish people just redeemed from Egypt and make of Moses a great nation (Exodus 32:10), could have turned the spotlight on and celebrated themselves. Instead they exercised humility... *“My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.”* ‘Even though I (Mary) was chosen, it is not about me, but about the greatness of God’s actions (the savior to be born) that will come to pass through me.’ Our Blessed Mother knew, and we hope to realize, that She could not have done this Herself. She could not conceive a child by Herself. Any child that would have been conceived through Her conjugal marriage to Joseph would have been only human and certainly not a savior. And, no matter how that child died, it would not have either risen from the dead nor redeemed the world. It is only through the action of God, that any of this is possible. So how could She and we possibly take any credit for ourselves, when it is only by God that we are saved.

Mary is not only the Mother of God, but also one of those redeemed by Him. In this we are co-heirs with Mary. We have been given the opportunity to be saved if only we follow the example of the Mother of Him who can save us. We must first realize we have a soul... *“My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord.”* This automatically brings our minds to realm of acknowledging the existence of God and the continuous involvement of God in our lives. Our souls, also, all the actions of our very selves should *“proclaim(s) the greatness of the Lord.”* This is our purpose. Not to proclaim ourselves... but to proclaim God. And not just the existence of God, but because our *“soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord,”* we are acknowledging God’s supremacy over us and the need for us to submit our wills to God.

We, though, are not only acknowledging the existence of God and His primacy over us, we, in mirroring the words of Our Blessed Lady, are saying that we can only be saved with Him... *“my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.”* There is nothing we can do to save ourselves. We are not God. We are not even gods. If we think we are, we are deluded and have succumbed to the Evil One, The Father of Lies, and are his children. (John 8:31f)

We are called to proclaim that God is Our Father in all the works of our day and all the beliefs we hold dear. It is only in professing the Truths of the Church and our submission of our wills to God and His Church that we will truly rejoice in God as Savior. Let us turn to Our Blessed Lady during this month dedicated to Her. Let us learn from Her as we pray the Rosary. Let us be humble before our God. Let us proclaim God in all we think, speak and do. Let us rejoice along with Our Blessed Mother that only God the Son, Our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ, is our Savior.

God love you... Father Fernan
