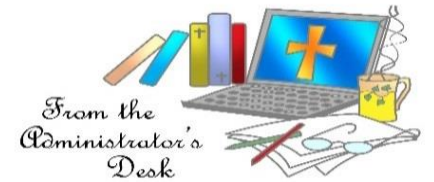

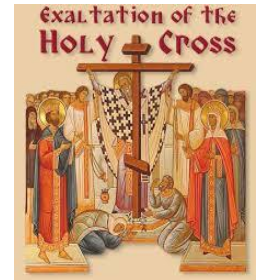

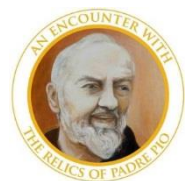

- **Feast of the Exultation of the Cross:** The Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross, celebrated every year on September 14, recalls three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine: the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulcher and Mount Calvary: and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II. The Feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the life giving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin when he ate from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil in the Garden of Eden. *O God who willed that Your Only begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant that we who have known His mystery on earth may merit the grace of His redemption in Heaven, through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit in God forever and ever, Amen. – from the USCCB.*



- **Work Updates:** The LED Lighting work is progressing. Wilden Electrics through Con Edison finished the outdoor lighting on the church and school this week as well as a few fixtures in the school. As you may notice one of our lanterns in the church located near the statue of Saint Eugene has been removed so that they can evaluate the fixture and replace all the internal parts. As for the light boxes, we are waiting for a recommendation for the best course of action to replace all of the lighting in the boxes. This will require a representative from the stain glass company that installed the glass to remove them from the walls. The school reopened this week with all of the classrooms that were affected by the flood ready, with new floors and new paint. The gym floor is in the process of being repaired and will be ready in the next few weeks. The air conditioners on the roof of the church were installed two weeks ago as well as thermostats for all 10 units. Our air conditioner company as well as the electricians faced many challenges when they opened all of the old units. We are awaiting final inspection of all of the work.
- **Saint Eugene Religious Education** – Registration forms for the upcoming school year have been mailed out to all of our families who attended last year. If you are new to our program or have not received the forms, they can be retrieved from the church office during normal business hours, which are Monday – Friday 9:30-3:30. Religious Education classes will begin on Wednesday, September 27. Classes are held on Wednesdays. The times for the classes are as follows: grades 1-6 3:45-5:15 and grades 7-8 6:30-8:00.
- **Saint Eugene CYO** : Saint Eugene Parish has a vibrant CYO with competitive boys and girls basketball teams and Cheerleading squads. All are coached by parent and student (18 and over) volunteers. All must be cleared through the Safe Environment Office of the Archdiocese of New York. Registration will be in September for basketball and cheer weeknight practices starting in October and continuing through March. The basketball season begins in November and games are played throughout Westchester County. Cheerleading is done at home games. Parents of CYO participants are asked to support the program by attending games, volunteering during the games, and cheering for the players as well as being models of sportsmanship. 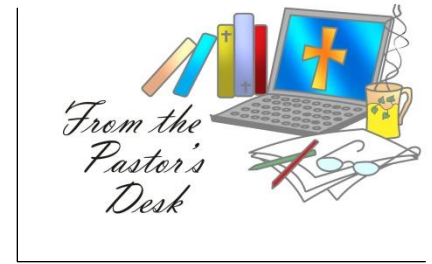

Beloved of God,

SAINT MOTHER TERESA... September 5th

“After their audience with the king the Magi set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary His mother. They prostrated themselves and did Him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. When they had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, “Rise, take the child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy Him.” Joseph rose and took the child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod, that what the Lord had said through the prophet might be fulfilled, “Out of Egypt I called my son.” When Herod realized that he had been deceived by the magi, he became furious. He ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had ascertained from the magi. Then was fulfilled what had been said through Jeremiah the prophet: “A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children, and she would not be consoled, since they were no more.” (Matthew 2:9-18)



From property to a blessing to the Divine. We are welcoming back all the children from their summer respite with their parents, families and friends to once again fill the halls and classrooms of the school as well as round out our community of faith as they join us in the aisles and sanctuary of our church. What a joy it is to see them once again... to hear their voices blended with ours during the Holy Prayers of the Holy Mass... to see them come forward to receive Holy Communion or bow their heads to be blessed before God. We don't consider them property to be used and discarded. They have become a part of the fabric of our lives. We know, though, at one time, and still in many parts of our world, that we did/still do consider these *smaller "Temples of the Holy Spirit"* chattel, disposable. I cannot begin to explain, but you mothers know what it is like to have this soul growing within you. How just 21 days after conception, noticing a separate heartbeat of this truly unique creation of God, this distinct soul, this child, not just of the parents, but most appropriately this "Child of God." People have interminably asked the question and pondered the possibilities of "Which came first... the chicken or the egg?" In reality it doesn't matter which came first... because the real question to acknowledge is "Who created the chicken or the egg?" God is the Creator. There is a misunderstanding long ago formed within the heart of people... that we are the creators. *We are not the authors of Life.* When a husband and wife in the loving act of freely giving themselves to the other, they open their hearts and lives to possibility of a love going beyond them in the gift from God of a Child. Gift from God because... no human male creates sperm... no human female creates eggs. God is the creator. God is the Author of Life.

Saint Mother Teresa worked to drive this point home. Through her efforts with the poor, she worked tirelessly to show the world that all of God's children, no matter how marginalized or discarded they may be by society, are just that God's children. The Nicene Creed which we pray every Sunday at Holy Mass teaches us that Our Blessed Lord *"by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."* This does not mean that only since Our Lord took on humanity was it blessed, but it is a reminder of how sacred is the humanity that God created that it was worthy enough to be the tabernacle of the Divine Son of God.

The lesson of the Magi given above from Matthew's Gospel is also a reminder that through sin Evil has set itself against humanity, this creation of God that bears the Almighty's image. Not only will the Evil do everything it can to turn us away from God, foremost by deluding us into thinking we are god, but the Evil will set us upon each other. What better way than having us kill the other... beginning with the most innocent – the Child born or pre-born. The Evil One smiles every time a child is killed in the womb.
