The recipe for the chicken legs and thighs is as follows: Wash and clean chicken, season, place chicken in large tray, add ½ cup water. Bake at 375 degrees skin side down for 45 minutes, turn chicken over, season and bake skin side up for an additional 45 minutes. When the chicken is done sprinkle with paprika. *Please drain all juices and transport the chicken in Ziploc bags*

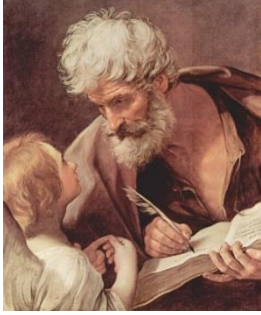
Eucharistic Vigil for the Holiness of Priests & Holy Vocations:

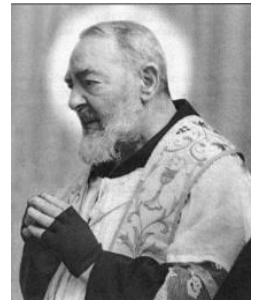
Dear Parishioners:

- **Feast Days** –Thursday, September 21, is the **Feast of Saint Matthew**, please join us as we honor this beloved apostle and evangelist and the namesake of our Pastor, Father Matthew Fernan. *O Glorious Saint Matthew, in your Gospel you portray Jesus as the longed-for Messiah who fulfilled the Prophets of the Old Covenant and as the new Lawgiver who founded a Church of the New Covenant. Obtain for us the grace to*

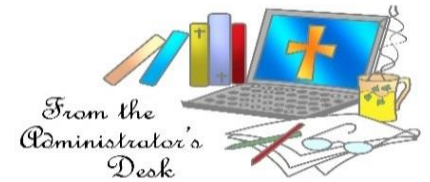


see Jesus living in His Church and to follow His teachings in our lives on earth so that we may live forever with Him in heaven.- from catholic saints online. Saturday, September 23 is the **Feast of Saint Padre Pio**, Priest. Commencing his seven-year study for the priesthood, Fr. Pio traveled to the friary of Saint Francis of Assisi by oxcart at 17, he suddenly fell ill, complaining of loss of appetite, insomnia, exhaustion, fainting spells, and terrible migraines. Religious devotees and hagiographers point to this time, when he was suffering physical illness that inexplicable phenomena allegedly began to occur. During prayers, Fr. Pio appeared to others to be in a stupor, as if he were absent. In June 1905, Fr. Pio's health worsened to such an extent that his superiors decided to send him to a mountain convent, in the hope that the change of air would do him some

good. This had little impact, however, and doctors advised that he return to his home town. Even there his health failed to improve. Despite this, On January 27, 1907, he still made his solemn profession. On September 20, 1918, while hearing confessions, Padre Pio had his first occurrence of the stigmata: bodily marks, pain, and bleeding in locations corresponding to the crucifixion wounds of Jesus Christ. This phenomenon continued for fifty years, until the end of his life. The blood flowing from the stigmata smelled of perfume or flowers, a phenomenon mentioned in stories of the lives of several saints and often referred to as the *odor of sanctity*. from EWTN. The Padre Pio Foundation has organized a first-time tour of the official relics of Padre Pio, on the occasion of the 130th anniversary of his birth and the 15th anniversary of his canonization, here in the United States. St. Patrick's Cathedral has been blessed to welcome these beautiful and holy relics for full veneration throughout the day this Sunday, September 17 and tomorrow Monday, September 18 from 7:00am-8:00pm each day to commemorate their first stop on this once in a lifetime tour. 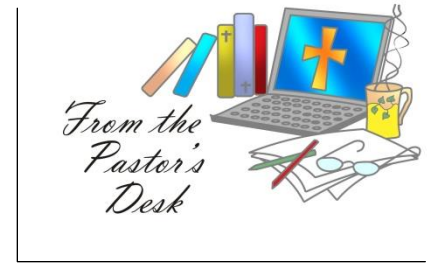

I am on his list. Mailed regularly to the church offices are invitations for a variety of functions from the Office of the Mayor of Yonkers, the Honorable Mike Spano... Irish Remembrance, Italian Remembrance, Yonkers Clergy Conference, 9/11 Memorial Service, to name just a few. I try to make as many events as possible because, since it is unusual for clergy to be included in anything governmental, bringing the face of the Catholic Church into these arenas is of the greatest importance. Of course, I cannot make them all. Over the summer, another of many invitations was received in the offices. This one, however, could not be missed.

At the new City Hall Unity Fountain, hundreds of chairs were in place under a magnificent sky as many souls gathered for one purpose. There were families of workers, families of civil servants, and families of Yonkers families milling about waiting for the *patriarch of one family* as well as the *member of so many other families* to arrive. When he did, he did not wait for all to get on line to see him, he searched them out, remembering all their names and sharing stories past. You might call him a politician. Many might call him a politician. I prefer to call him... servant.

On Thursday, September 7th, 4:15p.m., the Honorable Angelo R. Martinelli, Mayor of Yonkers, 1974-79, 1982-87, was honored with a *Lifetime Achievement Award*. Plaques and citations were abundant. All of Mr. Martinelli's sons, their wives and children, including yet another little Angelo Martinelli, were present. Carol, whom many of you would know as Angelo's wife of 65 years, was present not only in spirit but through her family. Many had much to say... but nothing more important or poignant than our parishioner's own words... "I am going to tell the secret to being a good politician... having a wonderful family." Because, it is in family that we learn the value of service.
