CATHOLIC WIDOWS AND WIDOWERS

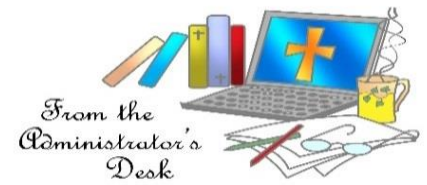

- **Right to Life Month:** Intercessions for us to pray every day: For Life For all people throughout the world: that they might recognize and treat each person as a masterpiece of God's creation; *We pray to the Lord:* For the poor, the homeless, and all who are in need: that they may receive love, respect, and the material

birthparents placing their children with adoptive families may receive abundant support; *We pray to the Lord:* That all women, men, and family members suffering from abortion may know the Lord's tender, healing love; *We pray to the Lord:* For those who are ill: may they draw strength from the Sacred Heart of Jesus, who is always with us in our suffering; *We pray to the Lord:* For parents who have lost a child through miscarriage: that they may know the comfort and hope that Jesus brings; *We pray to the Lord:* For all elected officials: that throughout their service, they may respect the dignity of each person; *We pray to the Lord:* - from the USCCB.

- **Saint Eugene Choir:** Each weekend under the direction of our Music Director, *Jerry Celestino* we are given the chance to lift our voices high in the Holy Mass. What is the importance of music and singing in the Mass? Music that blends both spiritual and artistic excellence is liturgical, it is sacred. Music has the ability to cultivate, strengthen, and deepen the spiritual experience of those gathered for worship. Liturgical music never dominates, but serves. Sacred music imparts spiritual truth to one's mind, heart, and soul. It displays a dimension of meaning and feeling that mere words cannot. Music makes prayer more pleasing, promotes a sense of congregational unity, and confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites. Singing is an expression of joy. *In Colossians 3:16, St. Paul exhorts the faithful assembled in expectation of their Lord's return to sing together. He says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly..., singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God."* Our relationship with God is one of love, and whether we sing loudly or softly, on pitch or out of tune, sing. Our Children's Choir sings every week at the 10:00 AM Family Mass. Practices are held at 9:30 each Sunday morning before Mass. We are looking for adults who are willing to lend their talent and join our Saint Eugene Adult Choir. The Choir Mass is the 12:00 Mass on Sundays. The practices are held on Sunday mornings at 11:00 AM. If you are interested in joining either choir please see Mr. Celestino after one of the masses.

- **October 18, Feast of Saint Luke:** Saint Luke lived in the First Century A.D. He was a physician, a companion to Saint Paul whom he traveled and preached the doctrine of the new faith; he was also a Christian historian. According to ecclesiastical tradition, Luke was the author of the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel according to Luke. The first chapters Luke Gospel relate the story of Christmas. He is the only Evangelist to provide certain information about the conception, infancy and childhood of Jesus. The events described in the Bible by Luke include the Annunciation, the announcement by the Archangel Gabriel that Mary had been chosen as the mother of Christ. These words are the basis for the Hail Mary. St. Luke also chronicled the only Gospel account of the visitation, which contains what is considered to be one of the world's most beautiful prayers, the Magnificat. - *From the USCCB.* As we are in the month of the Rosary, let us not only pray to our Mother, but to Saint Luke as he gave us these beautiful words.



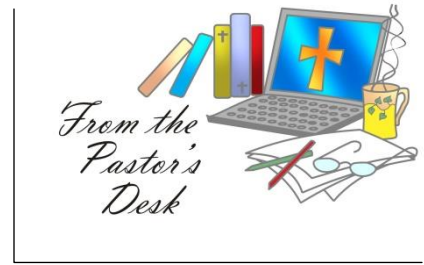

Beloved of God,

How did the Catholic Church develop Her teaching regarding Pro-Life and anti-abortion stances? Are they arbitrary?

The Holy Catholic Church founded by Her Savior, Jesus the Christ, teaches from the inspired Word of God... the Sacred Scriptures and has been teaching the same thing from the beginning... The Old Testament...



- **Isaiah 44:24** *Thus says the LORD, your redeemer, who formed you from the **womb**: I am the LORD, who made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, I spread out the earth by myself.*
- **Isaiah 44:2** *Thus says the LORD who made you, your help, who formed you from the **womb**:*
- **Psalms 139:13** *You [God] formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's **womb**.*
- **Isaiah 49:1** *Hear me, coastlands, listen, distant peoples. Before birth the LORD called me, from my mother's **womb** He gave me my name.*
- **Jeremiah 1:5** *Before I [God] formed you in the **womb** I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you.*
- **Psalms 22:10** *For You [God] drew me forth from the **womb**, made me safe at my mother's breasts. Upon You I was thrust from the **womb**; since my mother bore me You are my God.*
- **Psalms 71:6** *On You [God] I have depended since birth; from my mother's **womb** You [God] are my strength; my hope in you never wavers.*

The New Testament...

- **Luke 1:15** *for He [Jesus] will be great in the sight of the Lord. He will drink neither wine nor strong drink. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from His mother's **womb**...*
- **Luke 1:31** *Behold, you [Mary] will conceive in your **womb** and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus.*
- **Luke 1:4-42** *When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her **womb**, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your **womb**."*
- **Luke 1:44** *For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my **womb** leaped for joy.*

The Holy Catholic Church has taught and will continue to teach these truths. Humanity does not create life. There is nothing that a man or woman does to create sperm or eggs. God is the Creator... **2Macabees 7:22...** [a mother speaks]... *I do not know how you came to be in my **womb**; it was not I who gave you breath and life, nor was it I who arranged the elements you are made of.* And even in the act of sexual intercourse, there is still nothing a man or woman does to create. The divinely created nature of humanity and the Divine One make a new life. Therefore, **Psalms 127:3** is most correct... *Certainly sons [and daughters] are a gift from the LORD, the fruit of the **womb**, a reward.*

So...*"Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her **womb**? Even should she forget, I [God] will never forget you"* **Isaiah 49:15.** Sadly, yes a mother and a father do forget their infants. Sadly, these mothers and fathers are often pressured into these choices. Sadly, society and politicians have adopted Godlessness personally and professionally. Even though these millions of children have been discarded by so many... God In His Mercy Will Never Forget Them... and in His Mercy... God Will Never Forget Their Parents... offering His mercy... offering His Mercy... if only they ask to be forgiven.
