TWENTY- NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6 We are to worship God alone, the God who calls us by name.

Psalm 96 "Give the Lord glory and honor."

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b We have received the Gospel not only in word, but in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 22:15-21 "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Our First Reading today already gives us the Church's answer to the Gospel question about what belongs to God and what belongs to Caesar. All the power that the Persian ruler Cyrus holds comes from God. Just so with Caesar. What does he really have that does not come first from God? So the question is a false dichotomy, for everything belongs to God. Let us pray today for the grace to remember this when we face questions about where our true allegiance lies.

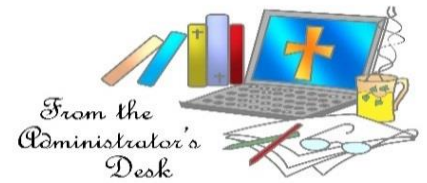

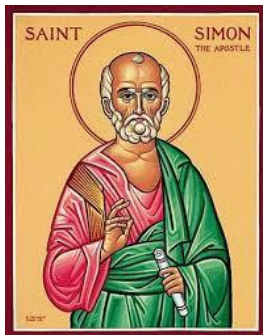

- October 22, World Mission Sunday: World Mission Sunday is a day set aside for the Catholic Church throughout the world to publicly renew its commitment to the missionary movement. It is celebrated on the third Sunday of October every year. It was created by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer for missions. *Almighty God, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to reconcile the world to yourself: We praise and bless you for those whom you have sent in the power of the Spirit to preach the Gospel to all nations. We thank you that in all parts of the earth a community of love has been gathered together by their prayers and labors, and that in every place your servants call upon your Name; for the kingdom and the power and the glory are yours forever. Amen*



- Feast of Saints Simon & Jude, October 28th: However meager in details is the history of these



glorious apostles, we learn from their brief legend how amply they contributed to this great work of generating sons of God. Without any repose, and even to the shedding of their blood, they "edified the Body of Christ"; and the grateful Church thus prays to our Lord today: "O God, through the work of the apostles You have spoken Your Word of love, Your Son, into our world's deafness. Open our ears to hear; open our hearts to heed; open our will to obey, that we may proclaim the good news with our lives." St. Simon is represented in art with a saw, the instrument of his martyrdom. He is the patron Saint of tanners and curriers. St. Jude's square

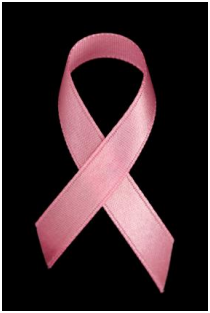
points him out as an architect of the house of God. Saint Jude is the patron Saint of the impossible and lost causes. St. Paul called himself by this name; and St. Jude, by his Catholic Epistle, has also a special right to be reckoned among our Lord's principal workmen. But our apostle had nobility, far surpassing all earthly titles: being nephew, by his father Cleophas or Alpheus, to St. Joseph, and legal cousin to the Man-God, Jude was one of those called by their compatriots the brethren of the carpenter's Son. We may gather from St. John's Gospel another precious detail concerning him. In the admirable discourse at the close of the last Supper, our Lord said: "He that loveth Me, shall be loved of My Father: and I will love him and will manifest Myself to him." Then Jude asked Him: "Lord, how is it that Thou wilt manifest Thyself to us, and not to the world?" And he received from Jesus this reply: "If any one loves Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him, and will make Our abode with him. He that loveth Me not, keepeth not My word. And the word which you have heard is not Mine, but the Father's who sent Me." - *from the USCCB.*

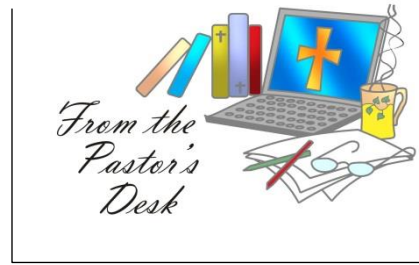

Every family has been touched.

The Cleansing of Ten Lepers.

“As Jesus continued His journey to Jerusalem, He traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As He was entering a village, ten lepers met Him. They stood at a distance from Him and raised their voice, saying, “Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!” And when He saw them, He said, “Go show yourselves to the priests.” As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, “Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?” Then Jesus said to him, “Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.” (Luke 17:12-19)



Every family has been touched. Not necessarily with *breast cancer* or even any kind of cancer. But every family has been touched... with illness, with suffering, with pain, with depression, with addiction (alcohol, drug, sex, gambling), with death (of the aged, the young, a child, a sibling, a parent, a friend), with abuse (sexual, emotional, physical, mental)... every family is in need of healing.

“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint (him) with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.” (James 5:14-15)

The miracle of healing is one of the signs of the coming Messiah... *“When the men came to Him (Jesus), they said, “John the Baptist has sent us to You to ask, ‘Are You the one who is to come (the Messiah), or should we look for another?’” At that time He (Jesus) cured many of their diseases, sufferings, and evil spirits; He also granted sight to many who were blind. And He said to them in reply, “Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.” (Luke 7:20-22)* But it is not just these outward signs that reveal that Jesus is God... *“Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above him. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, “Child, your sins are forgiven.” (Mark 2:4-5)* Jesus has shown us that we are to and should approach Him when we are in need of healing. As referred to above, every family has been touched, indeed every person is need of healing, whether that be emotional, spiritual, mental or physical. We need to have faith that Jesus is “the One who is to come...” to us to heal, not only our fractured relationship with the Almighty, us in whatever way God determines we most need. Sometimes we feel that we should be healed of some physical ailment, but God knows, as a part of our path to salvation, we need to be healed more of spirit in accepting some physical pain rather than the pain itself.

So as we walk through life, either on two legs, three (with a cane), or six (with a walker), in recalling a loved who had cancer and survived, a loved one who had cancer and was called home to God, as a cancer survivor or one struggling with the disease, let us remember that firstly, *We Walk With God* or more truthfully, *God Walks With Us*, and secondly, that as we “walk” through life with our trials, tribulations, illnesses, challenges, depressions, addictions, abuses and pain, only Father, the Son and the Spirit can heal us... *“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint (him) with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.”* How may the priests serve you? With the sacramental healing of Our Messiah.
