THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46 The leper will dwell apart, making an abode outside the camp.

Psalm 32 "I turn to You, Lord, in time of trouble, and You fill me with the joy of salvation."

1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1 Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

Mark 1:40-45 The leprosy left him, and he was made clean.

Leprosy features prominently in the First Reading and the Gospel today. In Leviticus, the leper is kept outside the community so as to protect everyone else from this communicable disease. But the leper in Mark challenges Jesus and Jesus breaks down the barrier between them, reaches out, touches him, and heals him. As we listen to today's readings, consider how we exclude others in our lives, perhaps because we feel they would make us "unclean," and how Jesus would respond.

LENT

Ash Wednesday is February 14th. Ashes will be distributed at 6:45AM & 9AM Holy Masses as well as at the 4:00PM & 7:00PM Services.

Stations of the Cross: Friday's immediately following 9:00AM Mass (unless a funeral is scheduled at 10AM) and Friday's at 7:00PM.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence - During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting requires that only one full meal be taken per day. Two other smaller meals may be taken during the day to maintain physical strength, but these two meals together should not equal a full meal in quantity nor is there eating between meals. Fasting obliges all those who have reached the age of 18 and continues to oblige through age 59. Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

Abstinence prohibits individuals from eating meat on a particular day. Abstinence obliges all those who have reached the age of 14 and continues to oblige throughout their lives. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence. Fridays in Lent are days of Abstinence.

FLOWERS AND LENT

As is explained in the ORDO... *Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and Celebration of the Eucharist 2016*, "During Lent the altar should not be decorated with flowers." On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday, a day of Rejoicing, they are permitted. Therefore, except for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, during this Season of Penance and Penitence, there will not be any flowers in church.

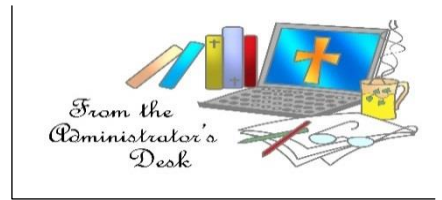

World Day of the Sick: Today, February 11 is the World Day of the sick. These are words from Pope Francis pertaining to this day. This is the twenty-sixth World Day of the Sick, begun by Saint John Paul II, Pope Francis turns to all of who are burdened by illness and are united in various ways to the flesh of the suffering



Christ, as well as to professionals and volunteers in the field of health care. "I entrust this World Day of the Sick to the maternal protection of Mary, who conceived and gave birth to Wisdom incarnate Jesus Christ, our Lord "O Mary, Seat of Wisdom, intercede as our Mother for all the sick and for those who care for them! Grant that, through our service of our suffering neighbors, and through the experience of suffering itself, we may receive and cultivate true wisdom of heart! With this prayer for all of you, I impart my Apostolic Blessing." – Pope Francis

Peter's Pence Collection: This weekend is the annual Peter's Pence collection. The Peter's Pence Collection derives its name from an ancient custom. In ninth-century England, King Alfred the Great collected money, a "pence," from landowners as financial support for the Pope. Today, the Peter's Pence Collection supports the Pope's philanthropy by giving the Holy Father the means to provide emergency assistance to those in need because of natural disaster, war, oppression, and disease. Ash Wednesday, February 14th: Ash Wednesday is next week. What is Ash Wednesday? And why do we have ashes on our foreheads, and do we have to receive? The official name is The Day of Ashes. It is called Ash Wednesday because, being forty days before Good Friday, it always falls on a Wednesday and because on that day at Church the faithful have their foreheads marked with the sign of the cross with ashes. The symbol of ashes or cross is because in the Bible a mark on the forehead such as this is a symbol of a person's ownership. By having our foreheads marked with the sign of the cross, it symbolizes that we belong to Jesus Christ, who died on the cross. This is in imitation of the spiritual mark or seal that is put on us in Baptism, Confirmation and Last Rites; "when he is delivered from slavery to sin and the devil and made a slave of righteousness and Christ". (Rom.6:3-18). Receiving Ashes is not required. However, it is to be strongly encouraged as it is a fitting and visible spiritual reminder that encourages one to adopt an attitude of prayer, repentance, and humility. As Saint James has said, "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up." (James 4:10) Let us remember that if we want to receive all that our Lord has for us we must participate, and we must open our hearts and minds to Him. **Ashes will be distributed at the 6:45AM & 9AM Holy Masses as well as at 4:00PM & 7:00PM Services. Ashes will not be distributed at the Church Office.**

The Rosary and the Season of Lent



One of the greatest gifts to the Church was, as tradition relates, offered to Saint Dominic by Our Blessed Lady on one of the occasions She appeared to him. Its mysteries are opened to those who meditate upon them as they recite the prayers of the Church – *The Creed* which helps us learn what are the basic tenets of our Faith, *The Our Father* which is the only prayer through all of scriptures that was given to us by God, *The Hail Mary* which combines the words spoken by the Angel Gabriel at the Annunciation and the prayer of the Church, and *The Glory Be* which is praising the Trinitarian Nature of God, Father, Son, & Spirit.

The Sorrowful Mysteries are moments given to us that help us delve the sorrow, glory, death, resurrection Of Our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ as He moves through His passion, beginning in the Garden of Gethsemane, to His Crucifixion on the Hill of Golgotha. Time spent with Our Lord during these two days of His life is of the utmost importance to us as it helps us to understand God's motives for saving us and God's method of saving us.



When the children were asked not only in Holy Mass but in the School and Religious Ed Classes, "What was the most important thing Jesus did?" they have always answered, "He died for us on the cross!" They have come to know this because you the parents are bringing them to Holy Mass, bringing them to Religious Ed and our Catholic School and please God, talking about your faith at home. One of the easiest introductions to them about Lent and a way to bring you all together in prayer is the Holy Rosary.

Please, then, consider this an invitation to begin to comprehend and appreciate not only the Season of Lent on a deeper level but the mystery of God's love and Our Lord's sacrifice during the week we call Holy. The Week which gave us hope that life does not end with the final beat of our hearts but continues on in the God's glorious eternal presence caught forever with Our Lord, Who is Divine Mercy, the Sacred Heart, Our Messiah and Christ, Jesus, the Son of Mary.

May your Lenten Season be filled with sacrifices that recall to your mind those made by the Savior for the Salvation of all. God love you... Father Fernan
